As the Church prepares to mark the Tenth World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation on 1 September 2025, Pope Leo XIV's message for the occasion urges Christians and all people of goodwill to recognize the urgent need for environmental and social justice in a world increasingly scarred by climate change, conflict, and inequality.

Entitled *Seeds of Peace and Hope* and released on July 2, the Pope's message resonates with the spirit of the ongoing Jubilee Year, calling the faithful to embrace their role as "pilgrims of hope" and stewards of God's creation.

Looking at the Reading:

In my youth I remember the song "Oh Lord it's hard to be humble when you're perfect in every way." by Mac Davis. It has a catchy tune and amusing paradox. Yet in Christ Jesus we see both a humble person and the Son of God, the sinless, perfect human.

The Book of Ecclesiasticus (Sirach) offers wisdom and instruction on life. Gentleness in a person is more valued than a lavish giver. Greatness should display humility. These "maxims" gathered by the author to guide others are echoed in Christ's teaching, the Beatitudes and in several parables and many examples of service.

In today's Gospel, Christ offers wisdom and instruction to his listeners while seated around the meal table. Avoid embarrassment, act humbly, show courtesy. Again, we see a paradox. The Humble are exalted, the Proud are humbled. This message is often repeated, even more so around the table at the Last Supper, Jesus said to the Apostles: "Kings who lord it over people, and those who have authority over them are given the title Benefactor. This must not happen with you. No; the greatest among you must behave as if he were the youngest, the leader as if he were the one who serves." (Luke 22:25-27) God gives us his grace and strength so that we may follow that example of Christ who serves.

Prayer for the Day:

God and judge of all, you show us that the way to your kingdom is through humility and service. Keep us true to the path of justice and give us the reward promised to those who make a place for the rejected and the poor. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour.

He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted! Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'

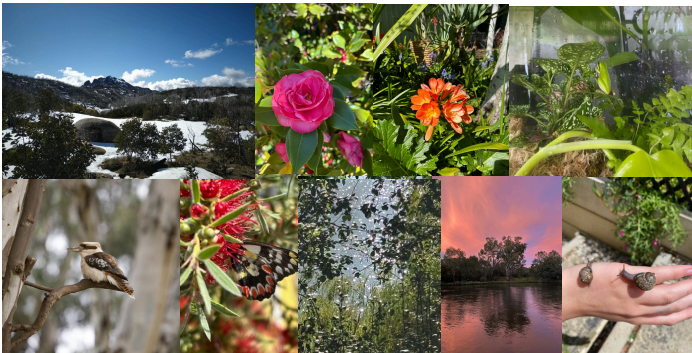

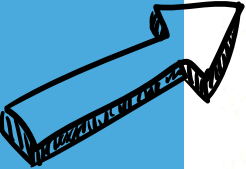

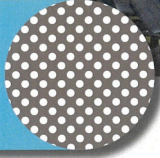

Pledge for Life-Saving Aid to Gaza:

Caritas Australia is calling on supporters to sign this urgent pledge, which will be delivered to the Australian Foreign Minister's office on Monday the 1st of September.

We do so in anticipation of new restrictive conditions for international NGOs that require them to breach the safety and security of their staff or face deregistration which will prevent them from providing critical, life-saving humanitarian assistance to Palestinians

These come into force on September 9th, and will likely see aid volumes fall below a level that is already claiming innocent lives. While Caritas partners are likely unaffected, it is clear there is simply no room for overall aid levels to drop. The people of Gaza cannot eat less than they already are.

We are aiming to gather as many signatures as possible in the coming weeks to demonstrate strong public support for increased humanitarian aid access to Gaza.

Every signature helps amplify the call to protect innocent lives and ensure vital aid reaches those who need it most.

The pledge closes on Sunday 31 of August

Liturgical Jottings–Liturgy and Charity III

In the course of the Liturgical year there are days we may focus the liturgy on Charity.

At Holy Thursday Mass service and charity are symbolised by the washing of the feet and the collection of Project Compassion boxes. The Hymn "Where there is Charity and Love is often sung.

The Feast of Sacred Heart of Jesus is also the Mass for the Poor where people, especially children bring food and winter woollies for Vinnies to distribute to the needy. Advent is a time to bring gifts and food for the Giving Tree or Christmas hampers for those in need.

Within the Missal for Masses for various occasions there is a specific Mass for Charity (40) with scripture readings in the Lectionary.

Its Communion Antiphon is "So faith, hope and charity remain, these three; but the greatest of these is charity."

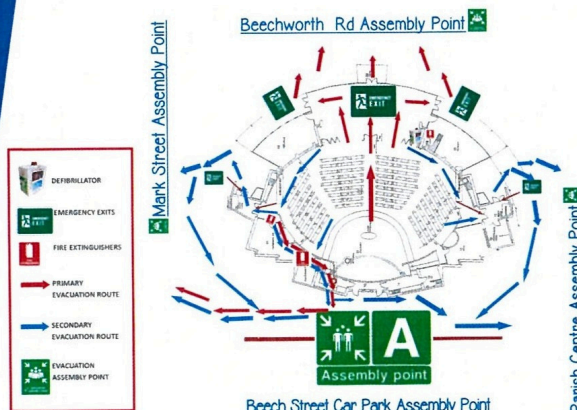

• Do not use any vehicles or machinery

RAISE THE ALARM
• Notify a nearby Person First Aid
• Do not touch or move any hazardous materials
• Do not use any equipment or machinery
• Do not use any electrical equipment
• Do not use any open flames or heat sources
• Do not use any mobile phones or radios
• Do not use any vehicles or machinery

UPON DISCOVERY OF AN EMERGENCY SITUATION:
• Remove yourself and nearby occupants from the immediate danger if safe to do so.
• Raise the Alarm - CALL 000
